Louie White 1944 Willy's U.S. Army Jeep

One of the photos shows it on display in the lobby of the Edward Allsworth Veterans Home here in Lebanon during the Christmas and Thanksgiving holidays. It is a 1944 Willys U.S. Army Jeep. This was purchased some years back from Mr. Dave Heintz of Albany. Dave rescued it from the blackberries and fetched it up to its current state.

Our oldest Son Mike Pomeroy and I purchased if from Dave and it has since become a "family thing." Naturally it has been shown at numerous car shows from Lebanon to the Oregon Coast and also in many local parades. It has garnered a lot of awards but the main feature was the attraction it holds for our severely autistic granddaughter. She became fascinated by it and thrives on riding in it.

The lettering and number designation indicates Patton's Army (actually the United States Army) but there is no indication it ever was attached to that unit. Those were chosen by Mr. Heintz because a close friend of Dave's father served in that outfit.













My son recently bought a new Mustang GT 500. Aside from it being a really cool car, it included an opportunity to attend the Ford performance racing school at Charlotte international speedway in North Carolina. My son invited me and my brothering law John to go with him. The school was a two and a half day experience. It included time at Charlotte speedway and the IMAX dragstrip, as well as several classroom sessions. There were fifteen other students in the class. (John and I were mostly spectators\ The cars used on the track were GT 500 mustangs [760 horsepower]. The only change from stock was the addition of a roll cage. Time on the track consisted of following the instructor who was an experienced race driver. The course included part of the full oval and the road course {the charlotte "roval". It was a real treat to watch my son drive on the same course as nascar drivers. Not quite as fast though. They reached speeds in the 140 mph range. On the second afternoon I got to ride in the passenger seat with on of the instructors. Needless to say it was thrilling, and glimpse of what nascar drivers actually do. One afternoon was spent on the drag strip. Of all the students, only my son and one other had any drag racing experience. After some instruction and a few practice runs, every was turning nigh 11 second elapsed times at between 130 and 135 mph. Reaction times were all over the place. Needless to say, it was a wonderful trip for this old car guy. Spending time with my son and brother in law at that event was a memory that will last forever.
