

CAR OF THE MONTH: Richard Thoma 1989 Cadillac Alante



#### My 1989 Cadillac Alante By Dick Thoma

Cadillac Alantes were made only from 1987 to 1993. They were built to compete with the Mercedes, BMW, Porsche and other sport models. A friend bought this 1989 in 1994 and took me for ride. It was love at first sight. This one has a convertible top and a removable hard top. Cadillac flew the frames to Torino, Italy where the firm of Pinin Farina assembled the bodies, upholstery, and trim. They were then flown back to Detroit, USA for installation of the power train and suspension components. The cars had traveled 3300 miles before ever driving on the road. They have a 200 HP 4.5-liter V8 mounted crossways.

My friend had moved to Las Vegas, and I had retired. We kept in phone contact, and I was going to Vegas every year to compete in the "Soldier of Fortune" 3-gun shooting match. He told me he was going to sell this one and buy a newer one. I told him I wanted it. He mailed the title so I could get Oregon registration and insurance. I then flew to Vegas and drove it home.

It doesn't get driven much since my wife passed away, but several grandchildren have borrowed it for their wedding pictures and trip. Another granddaughter and husband enjoy taking it to car shows when I'm showing it and my 1926 Dodge
