An interview with Loren Kuipers by Dottie Anderson

Dottie: Tell me how you got started in the business you are in and just how you got into the old cars and their restoration.

Loren: well, that is a really long story about my life but I will make it as short as possible. I rebuilt my first motor when I was 17, an old farm tractor which then kicked my career into high gear. After 4 years of college and 2 A.S. Degrees I tried several ways of making a living, including farm repairs, crab boat work,

auto repairs, then some auto body work where I learned body repairs on classic cars. I made the mistake of not following through on that one and continuing in the farm repairs industry. Now years later I am returning to that trade after running my own business for almost 30 years before retiring last April.

Dottie: So tell me about some of the vehicles you have had through the years and some of the ones you are working on to restore.

Loren: I have owned so many different vehicles through the years it is hard to remember them all but my favorite one I let go was a 76 Ford 4x4 short box ½ ton never had it stuck nor did it let me down, sold it for a smaller pickup as I was getting married and thought it was the right move. Boy was I wrong. Anyway some of the others were Chevys, Dodges, Datsuns, Hondas Chryslers, and that is just the cars not the motorcycles.

Dottie: So what is next for you to restore and what is on your agenda and time frame for those projects?

Loren: That pretty much depends on the time of year as I still am working part time, even though we had my retirement party. However the first thing is to finish the 51 Willys Jeep then it's on to the Hudson Hornet, then the 56 Chevy. Which one is first is a real conversation starter around our household as Deb says one then I say another so it is still undecided, as we all know she will win out.

Dottie: So just how many old vehicles do you own and what types are they, besides the 65 we all know you own and see you display?

Loren: Currently I believe I own 16 classics most of which are waiting for restoration, and 5 bikes for the same reason. I am not bragging here just making a statement. Of the 16, 5 are Chevy trucks, 4 mid 50's, 2 Hillman Minxs, 4 Honda 600's the early ones twin cylinder, a Pannard, Debs favorite, and I am most likely forgetting some. I bought most of these back in the days when you could find them in fence rows out at the farmers' fields. I would make a deal for them and bring them home and sit on them till later. Well later is now it seems.

Dottie: Just which ones are your favorites and how long have you had some of these vehicles?

Loren: Well one I have had the longest is the Honda 600 owned it since I was 21. My current favorite is the Hudson Hornet and a close 2nd the Willy's Jeep. The third is most likely the 67 Chev short box ½ ton as I am 2nd owner. The rest are pretty much just restoration projects.

Dottie: So why did you join the Rollin Oldies car club and when?

Loren: I joined because I got to know a lot of you through the first couple years of displaying the 65 and it seemed like a good fit for the two of us to join and we both enjoy the company. With Deb's current working schedule, she doesn't get to attend as much as in the past but we try to make as many as possible together. I believe we joined in 2014 or early 15 and as they say the rest is history.

Dottie: Well that about raps it up for me in my questioning. Do you have anything else to add to this interview?

Loren: Not much else to tell. Just hope to

see ya at the next meeting or car show wherever that may be in our travels of life and always remember: "KEEP THE SHINY SIDE UP AND THE DIRTY SIDE DOWN." May the man upstairs always watch over you and your family. So till next time, Loren Kuipers.
